Mok Wei Wei is presently Managing Director of W Architects Pte Ltd.

Mok's numerous architectural projects have received critical acclaim both locally and internationally and have been featured in many regional and international publications.

In recognition of his contributions to Singapore's architectural scene, he was conferred the President's Design Award in 2007, the nation's highest honour for design.

Mok is a board member of the Preservation of Sites and Monuments from 1999 and subsequently the Deputy Chairman of the Board until December 2016.

He is a board member of the Urban Redevelopment Authority since 2006, and is a board member of the Singapore Land Authority from 2015.

In recognition of his contribution to public service, he was conferred the Public Service Medal (PBM) in 2014.

Ho Weng Hin graduated from National University of Singapore, Department of Architecture, and obtained his specialist postgraduate degree in conservation from the University of Genoa, Italy. With an abiding interest in the study and conservation of Singapore's built heritage, his early projects include research on the works of the colonial Public Works Department as a Research Assistant with the Centre of Advanced Studies in Architecture, NUS. From 2005-2007, he co-edited Singapore Architect, the journal of the Singapore Institute of Architects, with Tan Kar Lin.

He is currently partner and conservation specialist consultant of Studio Lapis, an architectural restoration and research-editorial consultancy, and Adjunct Senior Lecturer at the NUS Department of Architecture. Working alongside international multidisciplinary consultant teams, Weng Hin is involved in major conservation projects in Singapore and the region such as the restoration of Cathedral of Good Shepherd, a National Monument, the adaptive re-use of former Beach Road Camp and Brittania Club, former Capitol Theatre, and the former Burma Railways Headquarters in Yangon, Myanmar. He is a founding director of the International Council of Monuments and Sites, Singapore National Committee.
